With the help of volunteers, Cleveland Maidan Association has shipped medical, humanitarian, financial, and military aid to Ukraine, and continues to









This chart reflects the value of items and financial aid shipped to Ukraine or distributed to local refugee populations by Cleveland Maidan Association throughout FY 2023.



In 2023, Cleveland Maidan Association acquired a partnership with Frontline Medical to collaboratively sponsor an upcoming medic training program in Ukraine.

The program will utilize 2.1 million US dollars to train 27,000 medics annually in 2025 and 2025, equipment 32 classrooms for sustainable training practice.
